2025 LOCATION

Thank you for signing up to the St Basils **2025 Hike for Homeless!** This year's Hike is in **Bakewell**, in the beautiful Peak District.

Bakewell is not just home to the famous Bakewell Tart- all routes take in the stunning front view of **Chatsworth House**, a walk along the majestic **Derwent River** and near the beautiful village of **Edensor**.

ROUTE GUIDES

As always, we will provide **detailed route guides** for each team as well as your team **Check-In Forms**.

These guides include Ordnance Survey maps, photographs from the routes, written instructions with **What3Words** prompts, an emergency contact number, and any other useful information you may need along the way.

Please look out for a **separate email** from us containing these files closer to the day, and ensure you have these documents **printed** out prior to your arrival.

CHECK IN /OUT

When you arrive to the **Agricultural Centre**, please head to one of our **Check-In desks**.

You will need your completed **Team Check-In Form** before you arrive. Your time of arrival will then be recorded and you will be ready to set off!

When you return to the start/end point, **please check back in at the desks to record your walk time**.



ON THE DAY

WEATHER

This event is taking place in **June**, so we are hoping for warm, dry weather. We will send you updates on the weather forecast as we get them.

BEST PRACTICE ON THE ROUTES

We ask that all participants familiarise themselves with the **Country Code** and stick to the guidelines within this guide.

AMENITIES AND CHECKPOINTS

Breakfast will be available at the start point for an additional cost, provided by local company **Farmers Feast**.

Amenities include **2 pubs** (*The Wheatsheaf, Baslow and The Robin Hood, Baslow*) on the **medium** and **short** route (which we will be utilising as checkpoints), which sell drinks and good quality British pub food.

Each checkpoint has **water, toilets, and energy treats**. All walkers are encouraged to bring their own water bottle and food & treats to enjoy on route.

COACH

If you have opted for our **coach transportation** on the day, please keep an eye out for a **separate email** containing all the information you'll need about your travel.

EVENT END

A **team photo** will be taken at the **Finish Line** and put online and soon as possible after the event. **Team certificates are available upon request.**

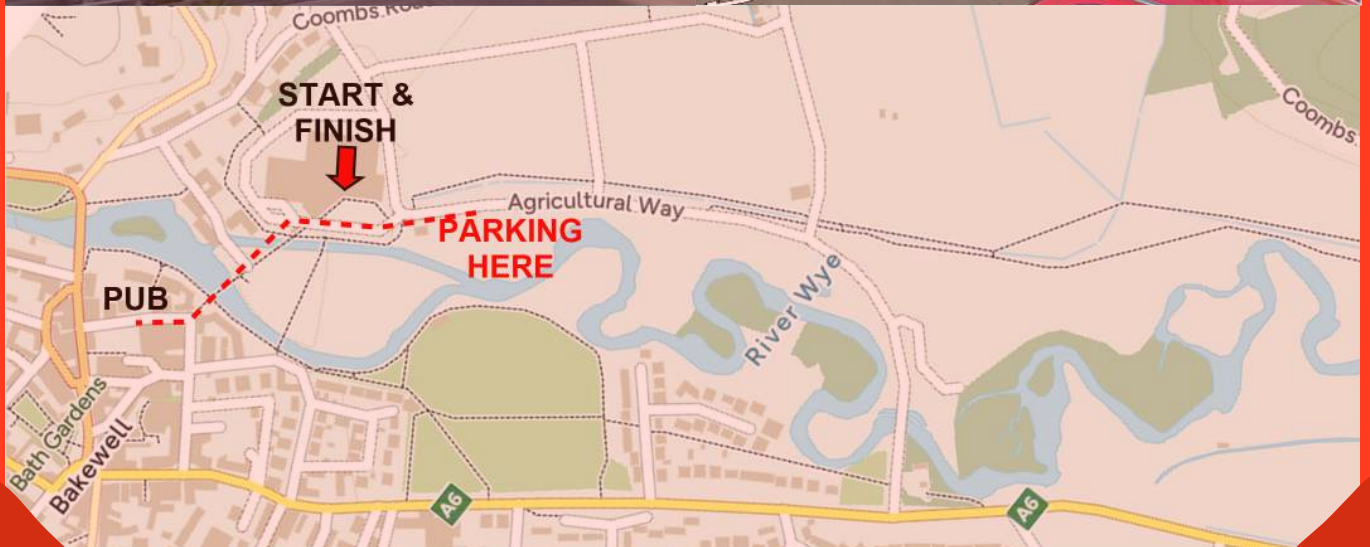
The Peacock, Market Street, Bakewell, DE45 1DS (200 yards from Finish Line)

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1) You must sign next to your name on the Team Check-In & Disclaimer form. By signing this disclaimer form you are agreeing that you understand the realities of the event and to take part in the event in accordance with these terms and conditions. If you do not sign this form, you will not be allowed to take part in the event and no refund will be offered.

2) For the LONG and MEDIUM Walk route challenge the minimum age for participation in this event is 5 years old. If a person aged 5 to 18 is taking part then a responsible adult (someone over 18) must register them, at the event sign the disclaimer form on their behalf and take full responsibility for this person for the duration of the event. There is no age restriction for people taking part in the SHORT route challenge but anyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.

3) All individuals taking part in the St Basils Walk are responsible for ensuring they are medically and physically able to undergo this activity.

4) Participants take part at their own risk and the organisers cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage to personal effects, for personal accidents or for injury or loss to third parties, other than as a result of St Basils negligence.

5) This event takes place on public footpaths, public byways and public highways. It does not take place on private land unless with express permission of the landowner. St Basils will not be held responsible for the state of any of these footpaths, byways or highways that are used on this event. At the time of planning and printing these routes, all mention thoroughfares were clear.

6) Teams must at all times have a minimum of three people. (This is for basic safety. If one walker is injured there ideally will be one team member to stay with the injured party and one to continue to the next Check Point where help can be summoned).

7) Everyone who retires must report in person to the Check-In Desk at the Finish Point.

8) The distances quoted in all literature pertaining to this walk are estimates and rounded up to the nearest half mile. We try to make each walk as close to a half and full marathon distance as we can, but we also allow for accents, descents and general terrain when estimating the overall distance. If the distances stated don't exactly match your 'sat navs' this is the reason why and by taking part in the event you understand this.

9) At least two mobile phones must be carried by a walking team and it is your responsibility to provide these. It is vital that the organisers know your whereabouts at the end of the day. If anyone is 'posted missing' rescue services will be alerted. False alarms can incur financial cost and could endanger someone in a genuine emergency!

10) The organisers reserve the right to stop walkers continuing if to do so would be potentially dangerous, (eg severe weather, onset of darkness). Anyone who then decides to continue will do so at their own risk.

11) All participants must obey The Country Code and the Laws and Bye-Laws of England and Wales as stated below and adhere to designated rights of way on tracks and paths on the route.

12) Whilst the organisers cannot prevent anyone from failing to comply with the above rules and safety requirements specified elsewhere in the event literature from undertaking the Challenge, they reserve the right to disown or withdraw support from any offenders.

13) This event complies with EDI recommendations and guidelines which means it does not actively exclude anyone from any protected group attending. However, certain sections of this event would prove problematic for mobility scooters and wheelchairs.
